Come and discover an outreach ministry that will help address the following questions:

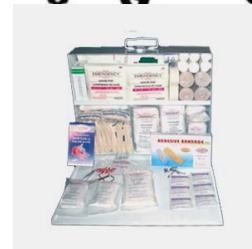
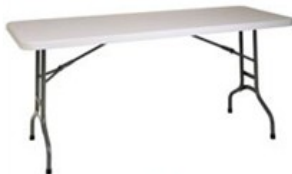
- How can we connect with our community in a meaningful and practical way?
